

Wright Regional Inspection Program - Goals

- ▶ 100% Coverage for Partner Lakes
- ▶ Reduced Excess Capacity
- ▶ Decontamination Available Every Day
- ▶ Low Wait times
- ▶ Better Staff Training and Supervision
- ▶ Improved Data Collection
- ▶ Addition of Exit Inspections

2018 Results

- ▶ Inspections Increased: 51%
- ▶ For Pleasant Lake the increase was 914%.
- ▶ 1,780 additional inspections.
- ▶ Coverage increased: 541%
- ▶ Compliance: 92.5%
- ▶ Wait times were low, with an average wait time of 30 seconds.
- ▶ Excess Capacity: 82%
- ▶ 68 inspections failed with 16 of those for zebra mussels.

RISK Sylvania vs Koronis:

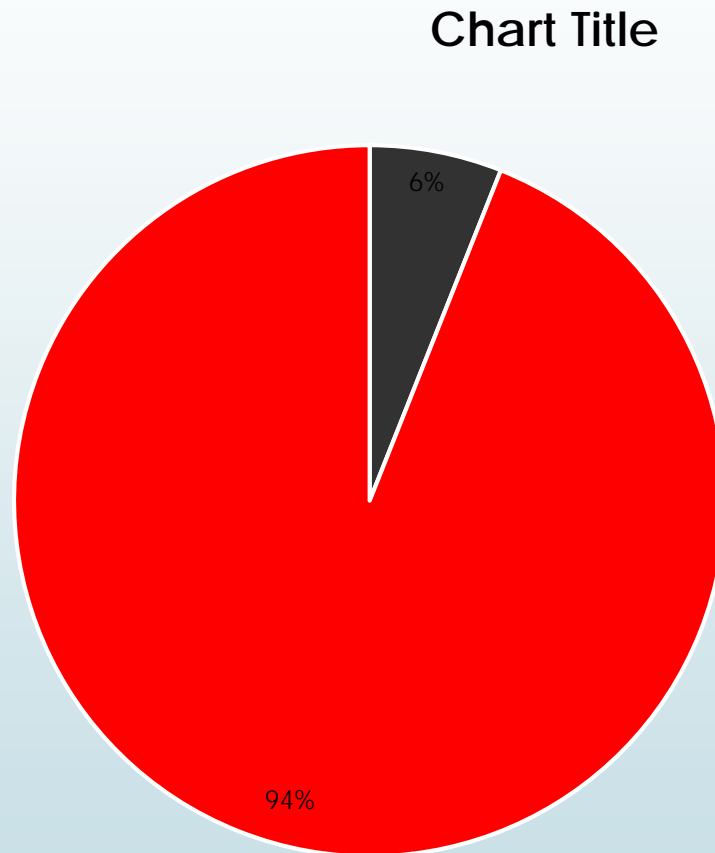
- ▶ Koronis – 500 Acres of Starry Stonewort
- ▶ Sylvania – 1 Bulbil, 1 Strand (1 inch)

2019 Status

- ▶ Wright County SWCD Plan Requires Expansion to 9 Lakes
- ▶ DNR Denied Expansion, Self Inspection
- ▶ Senator Anderson Proposed Amendment Requiring Expansion
- ▶ 9 Lakes Have Begun At The Ramp Inspections

The Problem: Cedar Lake 2017 Access Staffing

- ▶ In 2017, Cedar Lake had about 800 hours of access inspections
- ▶ Lake association purchased \$6,500 extra
- ▶ That only covered about 7% of the hours that the accesses were open

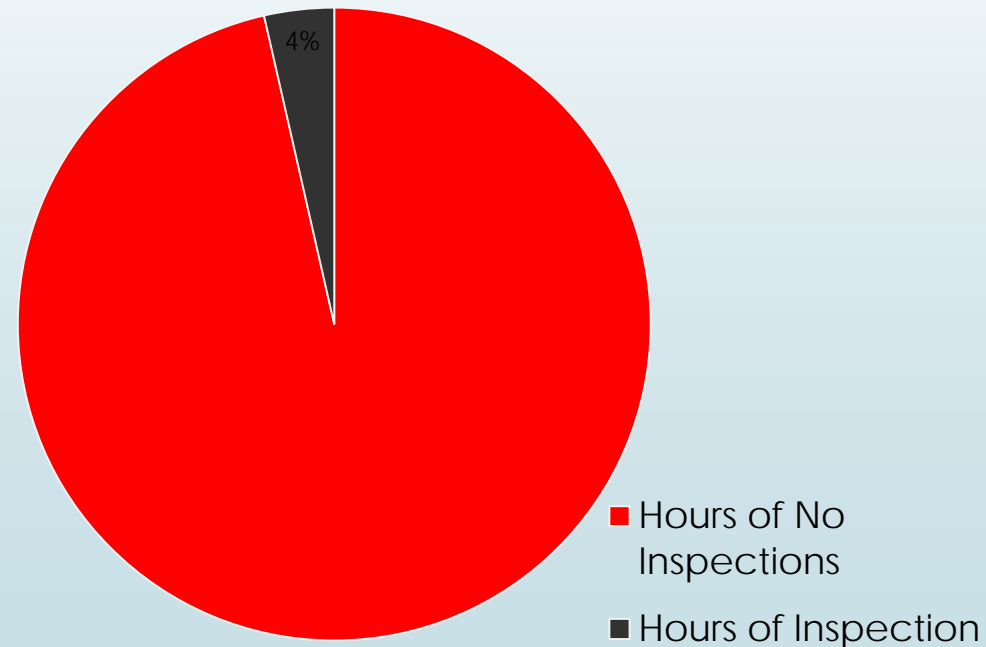

The Problem: Pleasant Lake 2017 At the Access Staffing

- ▶ In 2017, Pleasant Lake had about 500 hours of at the access inspections
- ▶ That only covered about 4% of the hours that the accesses are open

Pleasant Lake County Inspection Funding 2017

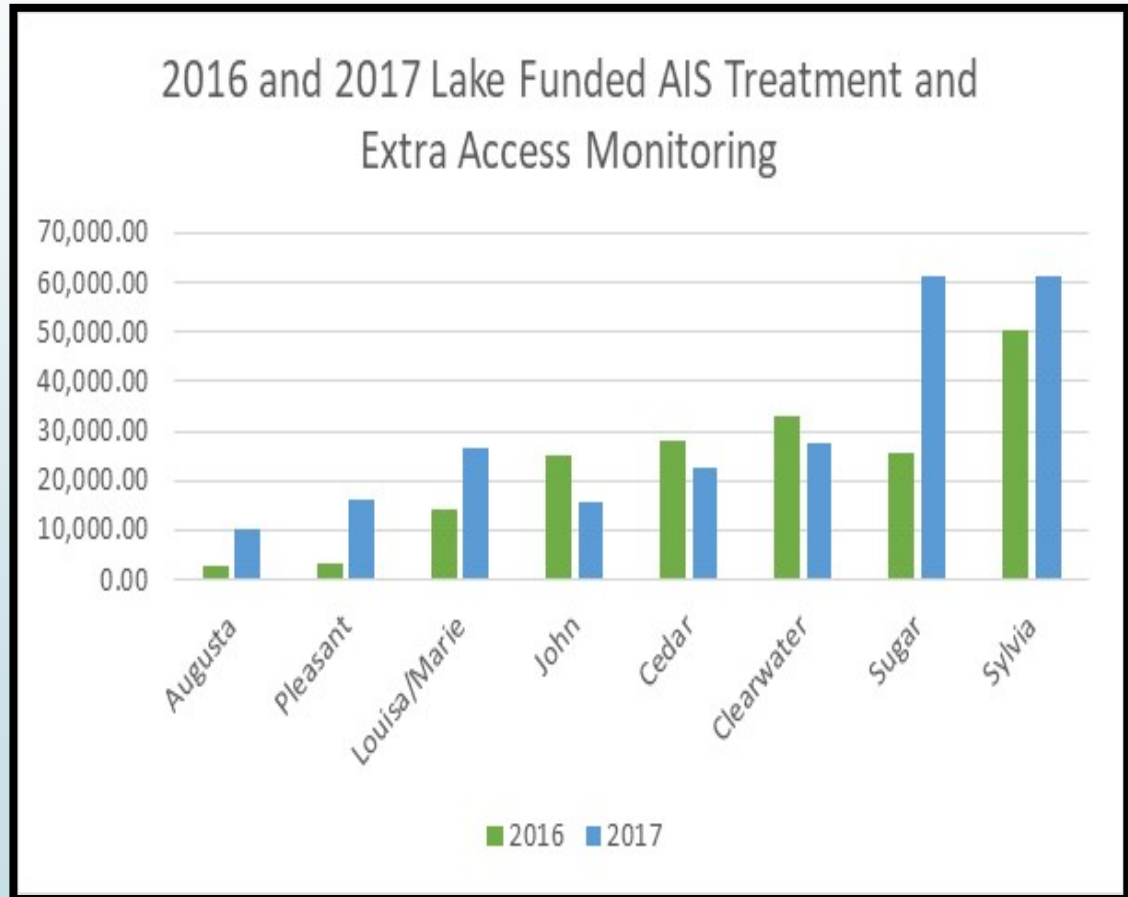


The Problem: Wright County AIS

- ▶ 80% Surface Water Infested
- ▶ 100% of 10 Largest Lakes Have Eurasian watermilfoil
- ▶ 50% of 10 Largest Lakes have zebra mussels
- ▶ 12% Have Starry Stonewort

The Problem: 8 Wright County lake association Spending

Eight lake two year total is \$422,000
